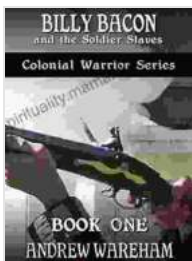


Billy Bacon And The Soldier Slaves Colonial Warrior

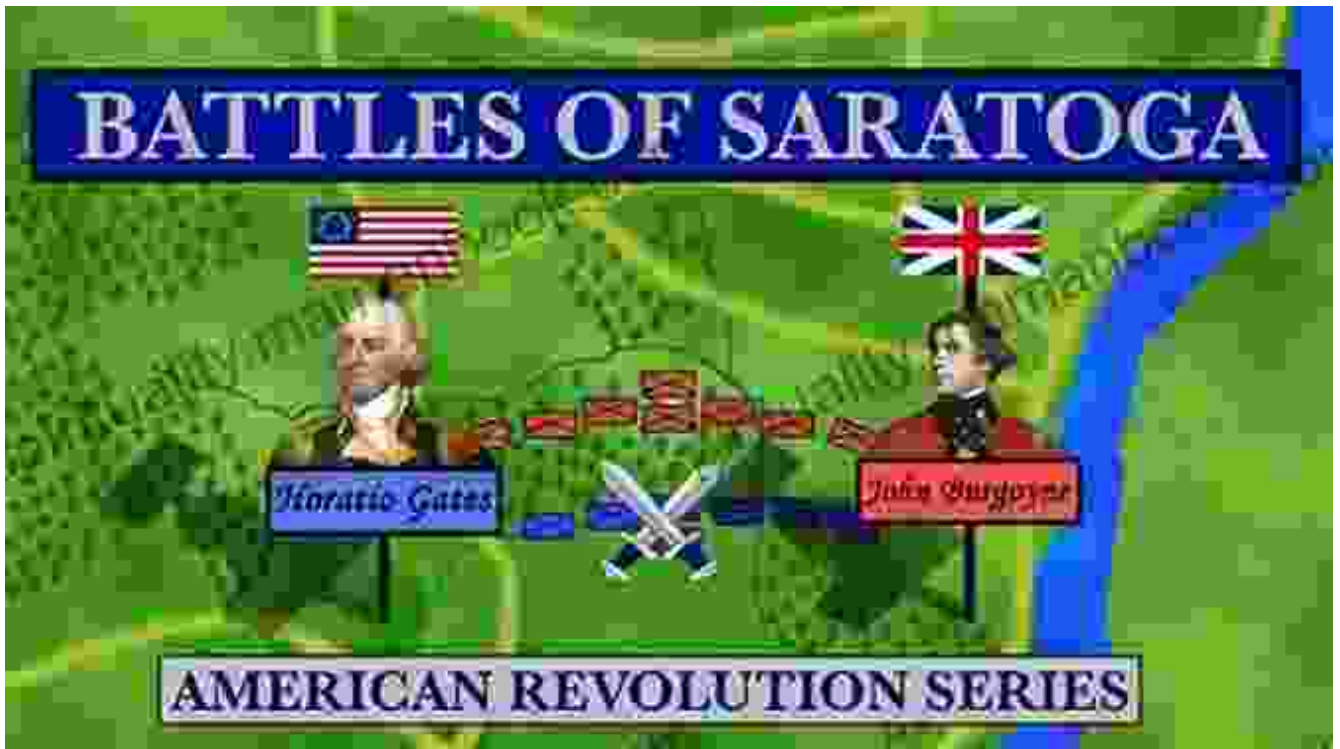

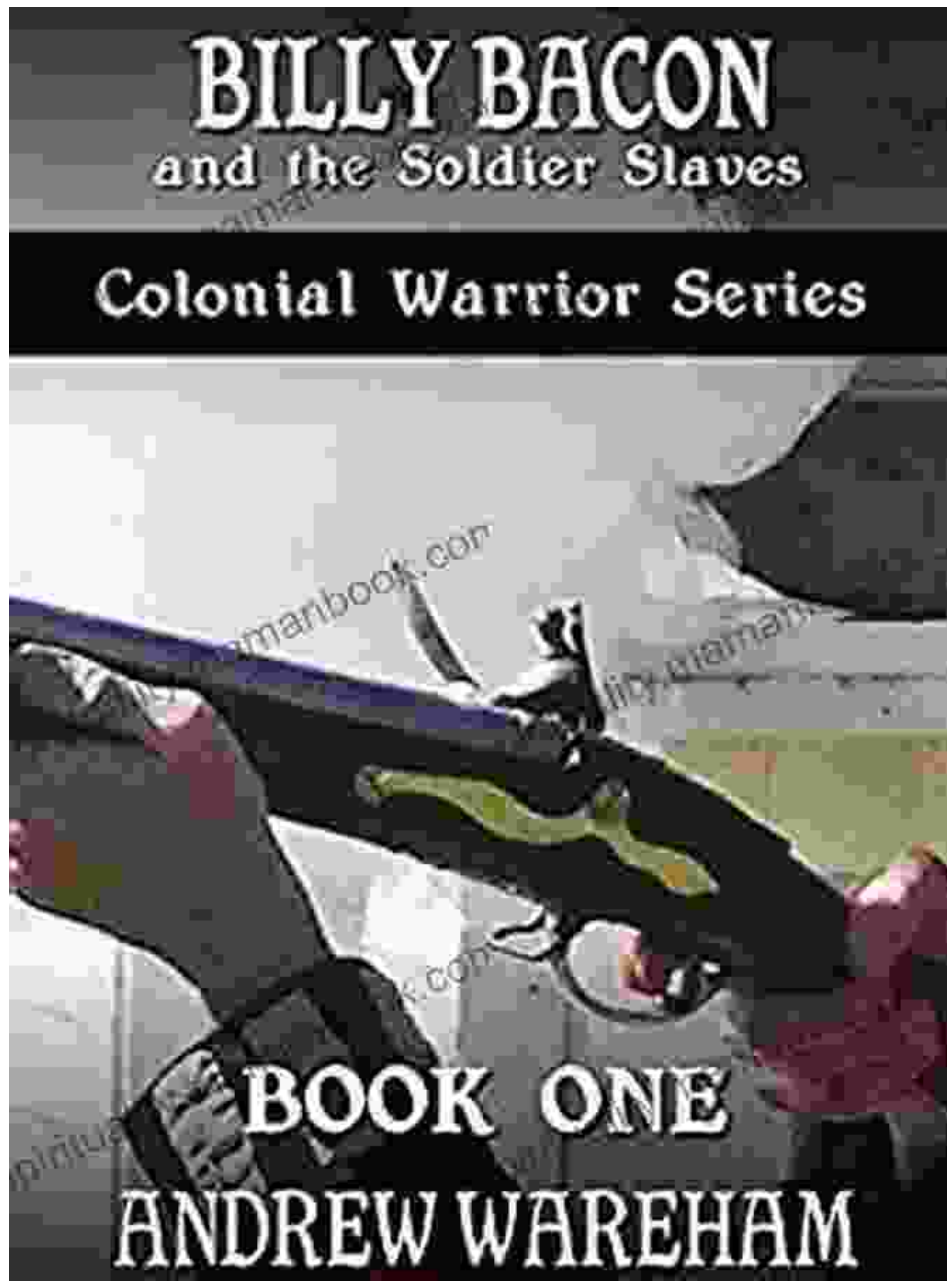

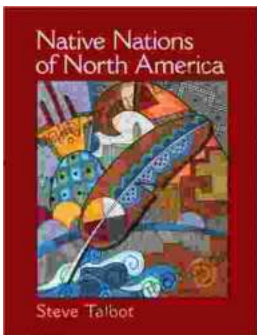
